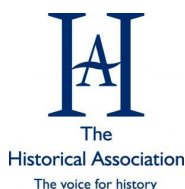

Workshop B: The riches of Benin

This workshop will explore what makes the history of Benin such a rich study for Key Stage 2 history. Taking the British Museum's Benin bronzes as his starting point, Paul will share a range of engaging learning activities which can be used to build pupils' knowledge and understanding of Benin and of its significance in world history.

Workshop D: Making the most of the British Museum collections in Key Stage 2 History

The British Museum holds examples of material culture from around the world. It's collections are often the product of past archaeologists who sent back the results of their investigations. Much of the content of the KS2 curriculum can be accessed through the resources of the museum. This workshop will investigate how the themes of war and wealth can be traced across different periods using resources from the museum's collections.

Workshop E: Teaching Prehistory

Are you looking for ideas and inspiration on how to teach the prehistory curriculum? Are you interested in how virtual environments could be used as a teaching tool? If so, attending this workshop will fuel you with new ideas and creative methods for engaging your pupils with prehistory. The hands-on workshop will use the British Museum's Bronze Age virtual reality environment as well as publically available 3D scans of objects, to demonstrate how teaching of this complex subject can be enhanced by free digital resources. You will come away with fresh ideas for teaching techniques to use with your own class.
