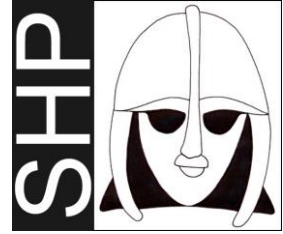

- Helen Snelson, Steven Stegers and Bob Stradling *Launch of the Historiana First World War module*

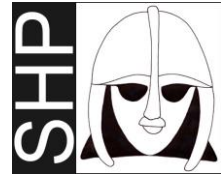
